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Abstract

The abstract text should be fully justified as this paragraph is, and it should stand alone, meaning that no citation should be attached. Additionally, it should provide concise information to the readers regarding the purpose, methods, findings, and value of the manuscript. Furthermore, the abstract should be reasonably nontechnical, yet adequately clear for an informed reader to understand the manuscript's contribution. The abstract should only be typed in the form of now more than two paragraphs and single-column format and consist of 200-300 words.
